"outcome, process and structure oriented long-term peacebuilding efforts, which aim to truly overcome revealed forms of direct, cultural and structural violence" (Reimann, 2004, p.10)




Music:



NEED FOR ALTERNATIVE APPROACHES TO PEACEBUILDING

- A rising critique of the liberal peace paradigm (Zaum, 2013; Paris, 2011; Campbell & Peterson, 2013)
- Need to engage "people's emotions, sense, and passions" (Schirch, 2005, p.1)




THE POTENTIAL OF MUSIC


- Transcending and breaking patterns of violent conflict requires the moral imagination (Lederach, 2005)
- Music provides the "wherewithal to imagine social utopia" (Leppert, 2005, p.93), enables transformation and communication (Bloch, 2000; Adorno, 1993)






